Home Upgrade Grants (HUG2)

The Home Upgrade Grant scheme (HUG₂) is designed to help improve the comfort and energy efficiency of lower income homes in Worcestershire that are not heated by mains gas central heating.

The scheme offers several other benefits, including reducing a home's carbon footprint and energy bills, with no cost to the resident. Worcestershire County Council is working with Redditch Borough Council, Bromsgrove, Wychavon and Malvern Hills District Councils to deliver this programme. Residents in Worcester City or Wyre Forest District can visit their council's website for information on the schemes operating in their area.
