#### Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2017/18

The main focus remain as in previous years - to address barriers to learning. For our current pupils, their barriers to learning are related to: concentration issues; the need to over-learn; social and emotional support mainly linked to attachment issues; speech and language difficulties which are affecting progress and independence within learning.

Inspiring them to want to learn and supporting activities that they enjoy and are good at is another avenue for expenditure, therefore purchase of reading books, access to peripatetic music lessons will be paid for.

Supporting pupils' emotional needs is paramount to them being able to access and learn in any other area, therefore PSHE programmes which support emotions as well as encouraging resilience are being bought into, trained for and resourced. Additionally, there will be a focus on Writing and Maths due to the fact that these were the areas where PP pupils last year made least progress.

#### Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2017/18

Impact is measured during half termly pupil progress meetings if not before. During these meetings, children's progress in academic success is recorded using the school's online tracker. Measurement of personal, social and emotional skills is based on observation of children in school and as this improves, will eventually support academic success.

Academic progress is recorded on the school's assessment and tracking system whereas personal learning skills, confidence and independence is recorded on pupil intervention sheets and measured against previous targets e.g. ability to work independently for more than 10 minutes; has confidence to interact during class discussions when previously this was not occurring.

Where interventions do not impact on personal or academic progress, these are reviewed and different interventions are put in place straight away to ensure that pupils are given the best opportunities to continue to move forward, make progress and catch up in their identified areas. One of the eligible pupils also has other additional needs.

Therefore, overall progress for PP children in across all areas is above expected, however as not all children are at age related expectations, it is important that this is maintained and improved so that the few children not at ARE do not fall any further behind.
