Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2013/4

Mainly linked to core areas of Maths, Reading & Writing in developing and applying basic skills.
Behaviour focus to ensure good learning.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2013/14

Impact has been measured using the school's assessment and tracking system to ensure that pupils are moving forward and making progress in the identified areas with the additional support and teaching put in place. In the Autumn Term 2013 resources were focused on the areas of Reading and Maths in terms of specialist Reading and Maths programmes. Spring term has had a Writing focus. Several children are making progress, but not enough for them to catch up to reach age expected levels; more than half of the eligible pupils also have other additional needs; two of these pupils are not in school full time.
