Nature of support 2012/13

Additional teaching assistants time for: one to one support and small group intervention/catch-up programmes.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/13

Mainly linked to core areas of Maths and Literacy in developing and applying basic skills.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2012/13

Impact has been measured using the school's tracking system to ensure that pupils are moving forward and making progress in the identified areas with the additional support and teaching put in place. The charts show which terms the progress has been made within and whether this has led to pupils' catching up and achieving at age-related expected levels.

On average, by the end of the year, pupils made 4 points (2 sublevels) of progress in each area of Reading, Writing and Maths.

Expenditure has enabled pupils to make better than expected progress on average, however, this will need to continue so that pupils continue to close the gap so that their achievements are in line with age-related expected levels.
