

Reading Challenge

On Friday 14th July 2023, all teachers will be collecting in reading books and records so there will be no home reading books after this date. This is so that we can prepare practise reading books in line with the end of year reading assessments that have been completed and pass them on to your child's new teacher, ready for September.

We still encourage ALL children to read for twenty minutes a day and to read for pleasure over the six weeks holidays. Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 will continue to be able to access the Collins e-learning books.
