Below is a grid containing a variety of short homework activities.

Please choose *at least 5* tasks to complete and return this book to school during w/c 18th May 2026.

I enjoy reading, writing and speaking.	Keep a food diary for a week that shows the plants you have been eating and the parts that they come from.	Research a plant from another country. Draw and write three facts about it.	Create your own plant. Draw it and then describe it. Is it a vegetable or fruit? Where does it grow?
I enjoy working with numbers and being scientific.	Find 4 different plants that grow in your garden. Draw them carefully and try labelling the different parts.	Measure out some ingredients to help with a family meal.	Plant some seeds and take care of them as they grow. Keep a diary of how your plants grow – measure how tall it is.
I enjoy painting, drawing and visualising.	Draw a flower / tree and label the different parts.	Have a go at pressing a flower.	Take some photographs of different plants. You could create a collage using these.
I enjoy being active and doing hands-on activities.	Gather twigs, leaves, pebbles and other natural materials to make a life-sized you.	Make a model farm / allotment / garden.	Make a fruit or vegetable kebab and talk about where each ingredient comes from.
I enjoy making and listening to music and poetry.	Write a poem about your favourite fruit or vegetable. Maybe write an acrostic poem or you could use your senses.	Sit in the garden, what sounds can you hear?	Think about the different animals/insects that visit the plants in your garden. Can you make up a simple song about one of them?
