## ParentMail

From Monday next week you will be able to inform school of your child's absence through the ParentMail app. as an alternative to calling school in the morning. School still needs to know daily and prior to 9.30 a.m. if your child is absent and the reason for the absence and this system should not be used for planned longer term absences that require submission of an absence request form.
To use this app to inform school of an absence, open the app, go to the menu on the left-hand side indicated by three horizontal lines. Choose 'Absence', this will show the name of your child/children, choose which child the absence is for and press 'Add', then complete the drop-down boxes and also add additional information about the illness so that we have a full record. Please note for bouts of vomiting and diarrhoea, this necessitates absence of 48 hours and can be added as a 2 day absence on this system.
You are still welcome to phone school to inform us of an absence, but this addition to the app now gives you an alternative method to do so.

## Strike Action

As you are aware from the media, the NEU teacher's union has called a strike and for this region the strike days will be:

$15^{\text {th }}$ March and $16^{\text {th }}$ March.
It is not entirely clear yet to what extent this action will affect school, but I am aiming to keep school open for all children albeit with some adjustments internally. If this is not possible, I will let you know as soon as I can.

## Sports Events

There has been confusion on occasion about when children are attending sports events outside of school. To clarify, the school is part of the Wyre Forest Schools Sports Partnership who organise and run a variety of sporting events for different age groups across the year. As a school we plan out which activities we can attend and ensure that each year group has several opportunities across the year. For most of these events, we are only able to take a team from that year group with us, sometimes this is as small as 10 . Therefore, we aim to give all children the opportunity to attend at least one of these events across the year.
If you have received communication about an event it is because your child has the option to attend at that particular time, but it might mean that other children are not attending the event on that occasion. Although communication between parents is very helpful as a reminder for events, on these occasions it can be confusing if there is only a small team attending. We will always contact you and ask for your consent prior to your child attending an event, so it is possible to check if your child is attending an upcoming event by checking on the Parentmail app or by contacting the office.
I hope helps to alleviate any confusion with regards to sports events.
