Pupils' Social Development

Is shown by their-

- use of a range of social skills in different contexts, for example working and socialising with other pupils, including those from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds
- willingness to participate in a variety of communities and social settings, including by volunteering, cooperating well with others and being able to resolve conflicts effectively
- acceptance and engagement with the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs; they develop and demonstrate skills and attitudes that will allow them to participate fully in and contribute positively to life in modern Britain

Examples

- School council and Worship Council-display, minutes of meetings, council members displayed, children wear badges to identify
- Secrets to Success-displayed in each classroom
- Marvellous Me (YR), My Space (KS1 and 2)
- Class rules and responsibilities-displayed in each classroom
- Each child a member of a team-children collect team points, Sports Day. Team events
- Residential visits (Y4 and Y6)
- Child Line visits
- Volunteer for buddies, helping at PTA
- Pyramid school events
- Learning partners-changed each half term, displayed in classrooms
